Land Use The Land Use Element establishes Resource Conservation zoning to ensure conservation of existing fish and wildlife habitat in Element the county, while facilitating its expansion. The RC designation is applied to forests and forested rangelands under federal ownership, to watershed lands requiring management and protection, and to the National Wildlife Refuges. In addition to forestry, acceptable uses on private parcels include grazing, mining, non-intensive recreation and low density residential uses.
