Summary of Oak Protection Policies:

Open Space/ Conservation, 1994	OAK WOODLANDS: The Open Space and Conservation Element calls for enhancement of oak woodlands and other native hardwood habitat by requiring all discretionary projects with potential impacts to include a management plan for oak woodland protection. The county is to consider adoption of a tree protection ordinance to promote conservation of native trees with historic significance including both heritage trees and oak woodlands (4). RIPARIAN VEGETATION: Areas of sensitive plant life including riparian habitats are to be protected by review of development requests to ensure sensitive areas are left undisturbed or are mitigated (3). Riparian vegetation should be preserved through review of development proposals and use of best management practices for agriculture (6).
Land Use Element	RIPARIAN VEGETATION: The Land Use Element specifies that riparian habitat along the rivers and natural waterways of Stanislaus County be protected to extent possible (7). All requests for development which require discretionary approval and include lands adjacent to or within riparian habitat must include measures for protecting that habitat.
